## Medical Devices: A Growing Threat to Healthcare Organizations

**BY 2020:** Worldwide growth of the **MEDICAL DEVICE MARKET** is expected to be **\$435.8 B** 

**67%** of medical device manufacturers & **56%** of healthcare delivery organizations (HDOs) believe an attack is likely in the next year on one or more medical devices.


**49%** of healthcare device organizations said the use of mobile devices in hospitals and other healthcare organizations is greatly increasing security risks.



Only **5%** of HDOs said they test medical devices annually, **WITH 53% SAYING THEY DO NOT TEST DEVICES AT ALL.**  ↔ 


**33%** of device makers and HDOs are aware of potential adverse effects to patients due to an insecure medical device. **BUT DESPITE THE RISK ONLY 17% OF DEVICE MAKERS & 15% OF HDOS ARE TAKING SIGNIFICANT STEPS TO PREVENT SUCH ATTACKS.**


**TOP REASONS FOR WHY DEVICES REMAIN VULNERABLE INCLUDE:**

- 1 Lack of training on secure coding practices
- 2 Accidental coding errors
- 3 Pressure on development teams to meet deadlines

 **80%** of device makers and HDOs report that medical devices are very difficult to secure.

**50%** of United States consumers would think twice about using any internet-connected medical device after a hacking incident. & **38%**  would be wary of using a hospital associated with a hacked device.

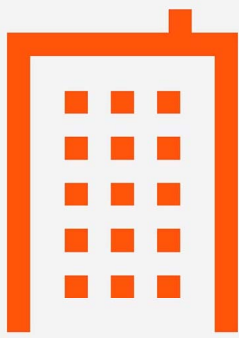
